# PROFILE OF SPEAKERS

## Prof. Prasanta Kumar Ghosh



Prof. P K Ghosh, completed his bachelor's degree from Visva-Bharatai in 1979. He did Master of Social Work from Indore School of Social Work in 1981. He was awarded PhD in 1996 for his research on Worker's Participation n Management in Multi Union Situation He begun his career as Labour Welfare Officer in 1982. He worked with the Ministry of Labour, Govt. of India, as Enforcement and Conciliation Officer for the state of Tirpura and Mizoram. Prof. Ghosh worked with Tata Institute of Social Scinces, Mumbai as Reader as well. He headed the Department of Social Work, Visva-Bharati for nine years and excluding his tenure as Principal, Institute of Rural Reconstruction, Visva-Bharati. Prof. Ghosh has been a Fulbright Fellow in Academic Administration in 2102. He has been a Visiting Professor to School of Social Work, University of Illinois, Urbana-Champaign, Dominican University, Chicago,USA, and School of Social Work, Geneva University. His research intererest varies from vulnerable children and women, community development, and persons with disability though he teaches social work and management. He has three books and 25 publications and research papers to his credit. He has been planning, implementing, monitoring and evaluating developemnt and research projects at the national and international level. Currently, Prof. Ghosh is Professor and Head at the Department of Social Work, Visva-Bharati, Shantiniketan, West Bengal.

## Dr. Rose Nembikkim



Dr. Rose Nembikkim did her M.A. in Social Work from Delhi University and M.Phil. and Ph.D. in Social Medicine and Community Health from Jawaharlal Nehru University, New Delhi. She has organized a number of training programmes in and around the country. She is the coordinator of the Certificate in HIV and Family Education (CAFÉ) and Diploma in HIV and Family Education (DAFE). She is also the coordinator of Pan-Africa e-Network project (A Government of India Initiative with African Countries) for the School of Social Work. She sucessfully completed a major ICSSR research project to study the issues of migration among the tribals and its effect on their health. She has published books and many articles and presented papers both in national and international seminars. Her areas of interest lies in Adolescent and youth, Women and gender issue, HIV and AIDS, Indigenous/ Tribal issues and Community Development. Currently, Dr. Rose is the Director-School of Social Work, Indira Gandhi National Open University, New Delhi.

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
