

It is also recommended that the length of the abstract and full paper should not exceed 300 words and 6,000 words, respectively, excluding preliminary pages, annexure and references. It should be written in Times New Roman, 12 pt. and line spacing- 1.15 lines. For reference we recommend the APA style. The abstract should include the title of the proposed paper, name of author/s, institutional affiliation (if any), email address and postal address, key words upto six and finally a paragraph of not more than 300 words summarizing the main findings and the argument of the proposed paper, and its significance.

The full paper should be arranged as follows: Title page, the presenter's name, institutional affiliation (if any), email address and postal address, Abstract, Key-words, Introduction, Methods, Findings, Discussion, Citations and references

It aimed at enhancing faculty capabilities, to promote resilient rural India through curriculum accreditation, research and interventions as well as curriculum design, development and promotion for higher education programmes offered by Universities and Autonomous Institutions in India. NCRI seeks to strengthen the rural higher education curriculum and the faculty members transacting it. The programme is managed by a mix of faculty from RGU as well as resource person from other regional institutions. The programme duration is from 20th to 26th March 2018.

Objective of Faculty Development Programme:

Due to curriculum interventions of NCRI several State and Central universities have designed and developed courses/papers on rural community engagement particularly in selected streams like Education, Mass Communication, Social Work and other related areas of rural studies. The duration of these courses/papers varies from six months to two years. As these courses are newly introduced, their transaction requires capacity building of the faculty concerned. It is in this context that the faculty development programme has been proposed to include both class room training

and field exposure.

Teaching and Learning Components of one week Faculty Development Programme:

Duration of the programme: 20th to 26th March 2018; Out of seven days four days would devote to class room training and three days for field attachment.

Target Audience: Potential participants will include faculty members from Social Work, Education and Mass Communication employed in universities departments, degree colleges and professional institutes of North East India.

How can I reach RGU campus?

Rajiv Gandhi University is located atop of Rono

Hills on a picturesque tableland of 302 acres overlooking the river Dikrong in the vicinity of Doimukh (2 kms) and Itanagar (18 Kms). It is well connected by road, rail, and air network. It has regular *innova, bus, train and chopper services* from *Guwahati*, approximately 357 kms away from here.
