## **1. About the Host Institution**

Rajiv Gandhi University, previously recognized as Arunachal University and now a central university serves as the key institution for advanced education in the state of Arunachal Pradesh. With a history spanning 42 years, the university's foundation stone was laid by the late Smt. Indira Gandhi, the then Prime Minister of India, on February 4th, 1984, at the current campus located in Rono Hills. Since its inception, the university has been dedicated to achieving a high standard of academic excellence and realizing the objectives outlined in the University Act. The University received academic recognition under section 2(f) from the University Grants Commission on March 28th, 1985, officially commencing operations on April 1st, 1985. Financial recognition under section 12-B of the University Grants Commission (UGC) was granted on March 25th, 1994. The institution, formerly known as Arunachal University, has since carved out a prominent niche in the national educational landscape. This acknowledgment came from a distinguished panel of the University Grants Commission, recognizing the university as one with the potential for excellence after a thorough evaluation of various universities across India. A significant milestone occurred on April 9th, 2007, when the Ministry of Human Resource Development, Government of India, issued a notification transforming Rajiv Gandhi University into a Central University. This transformation further solidified its standing as a noteworthy institution in the country's educational realm.

## **2. About The Department**

The Department of Commerce was established during the academic year 1995-1996. The department has ten qualified and dedicated faculty members. It has completed more than twenty-five years of successful operation, during which time it has made an impressive contribution to the development and growth of North-East India in particular, and India in general. The Department currently offers a Master's Degree Programme [M.Com.] under the NEP 2020, a Post Graduate Diploma in Banking and Insurance [PGDBI], and a Ph.D. Programme. The Department has produced many lawmakers, teachers, researchers, bank officers, civil servants, and students who have gone on to hold prestigious positions in government and non-government organizations.

### 3. Executive Summary

Representatives from Institute of Cost Accountants of India also shared valuable insights regarding professional courses, accreditation, and career prospects.

The seminar concluded with a Valedictory Session cum Second Alumni Meet, which encouraged interaction among alumni, faculty members, and students. Overall, the seminar successfully created a platform for intellectual exchange, professional networking, and collaborative learning, while reinforcing the importance of sustainability, technological advancement, and human-centric development in the era of Industry 5.0.

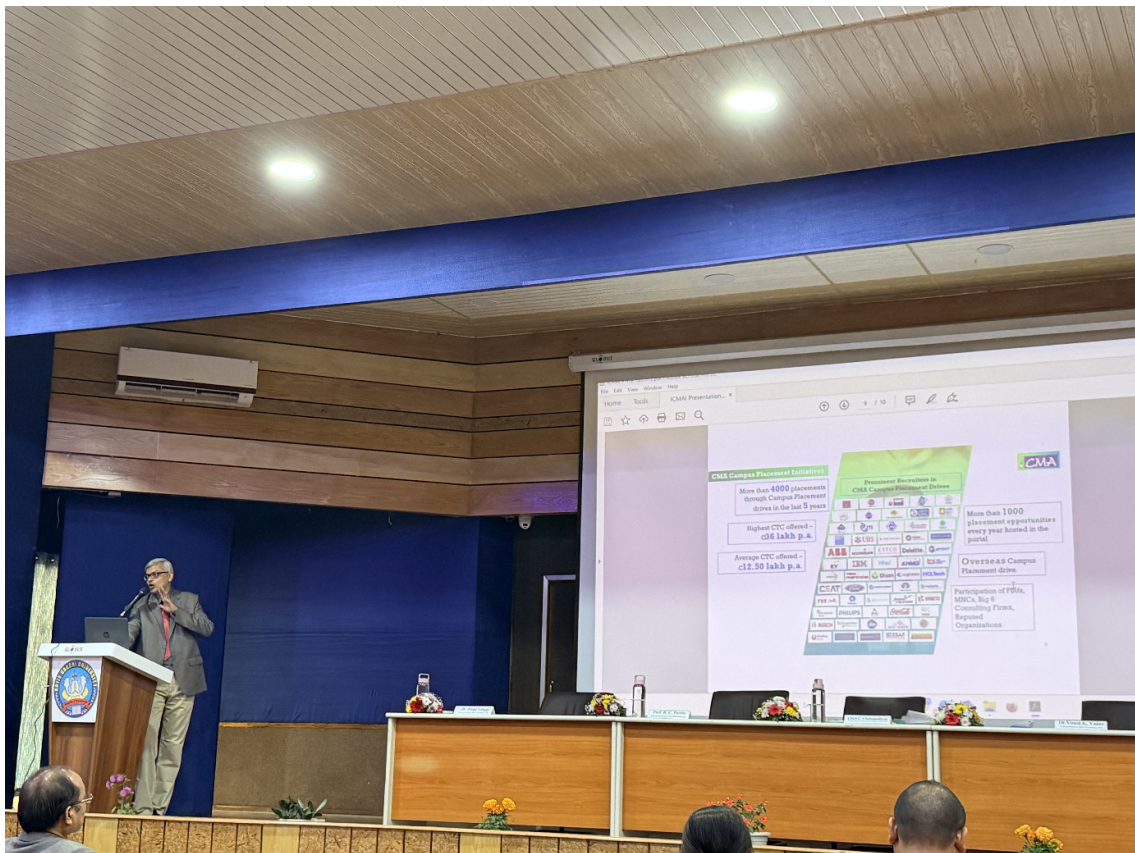

More than 200 people have been killed, several hundred injured and thousands displaced since ethnic violence first broke out in Manipur on May 3, 2023 when a 'Tribal Solidarity March' was organised in the hill districts to protest against the majority Meitei community's demand for Scheduled Tribe (ST) status.

At the onset, senior advocate Vinod Grover, appearing for one of the women victims who passed away recently, said that she was substituted by her mother and accused that the CHJ did not even inform her that a charge sheet in her case was filed.
